Introduction

The Closing The Gap (CTG) programme, powered by Yayasan Tunku Abdul Rahman (YTAR) is a higher education access and mentoring programme. The programme focuses on empowering high-potential and high-need secondary school students with knowledge, skills and mindsets to pursue higher education.

Since its inception in 2017, the Closing The Gap programme has empowered close to **651 secondary school students** (also known as Closing The Gap Scholars) across **141 schools nationwide** with the support of **467 Mentors**.

Our Scholars have unlocked more than **RM23 million in scholarships and financial aid** to pursue their higher education aspirations. From diplomas to International Baccalaureate, Technical and Vocational Education and Training, undergraduate degrees, and more—we support students to pursue various pathways.

At Closing The Gap, we believe that where our Scholars start does not determine where they end up. Our Scholars are now pursuing excellence locally and globally in institutions like Stanford University, University of Melbourne, United World Colleges, Sunway University, University Malaya, Epsom College, and Charterhouse College.

The Programme

CTG is a structured 2-3 year programme that equips high-potential and high-need secondary school students with the skills, knowledge and mindset to reach their higher education aspirations. The programme consists of 3 main components, which include:

1

Mentorship

Scholars are paired with working professionals and graduates, who inspire and guide them to transition into higher education. Together with their Mentors, Scholars identify personal goals, explore interests, and apply for scholarships and higher education institutions.

2

Enrichment Workshop

Scholars will engage in a series of workshops designed to equip them for scholarship applications and success in higher education. These sessions cover essential topics such as personal statement writing, mock interviews, critical thinking, and more.

3

University Residential Camp

Scholars will participate in an immersive week-long Residential Camp where they attend tutorials, work on assignments, reside on campus and engage with career professionals to explore their post-schooling paths.

Selection Criteria

General Criteria

- In Form 4, 5 or Lower 6 in 2026
- Reside within the Klang Valley
- Commit to the 2 year programme starting in 2026

Priority Criteria

We prioritise students based on the following criteria:

● **High Potential and Drive**

Demonstrate strong potential and drive to succeed in higher education:

- Strong leadership skills
- Evidence of overcoming challenges in the past
- High level of curiosity and grit

● **Need and Financial Background**

We prioritise students who:

- Household income of less than RM 5000
- Parents/family members have never attended university

Note: Proof of income will be requested during the selection

Briefing and Offer

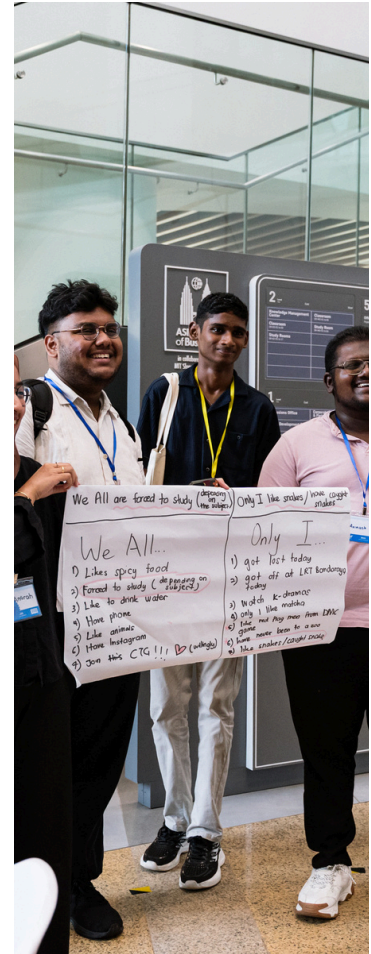
If you pass the interviews, you will be required to attend a briefing before we send you an official email offer. You must obtain your parent's permission to participate in the programme.
